The Parish Council met on Monday 13th. August 2018, under the Chairmanship of Coun. M. Clift.

The garage site had now been tidied up. The Clerk had been corresponding with Broadgate Builders regarding the Salem Burial Site. They had agreed to all matters regarding the fence and clearing of the site. It was decided to ask for a sum of £3000 to go towards the upkeep of this site and also to confirm that the site would be made safe.

The reply from the Police regarding the Council not getting any feedback on arrests etc was put before the Council. The Council thought that this reply contained no information needed and was in fact a standard letter.

Couns Clift and Young volunteered to go on the speed awareness course to try to alleviate the risk of speeding vehicles through the village.

A plan from Mrs Clare met with disapproval as it was on a blind bend with no proper access and would not be in keeping with the rest of the homes in the area. The proposed access belonged to the Parish Council and was the entrance to their allotments.

Coun Beehoo was to ask Peter Verdegaal to eliminate the moles on the Playing Field, so that it could be made into a better surface.

PCSO Abbotts told the Council that a stolen tractor and trailer had been recovered, and there had been a case of criminal damage in the village. The speed team had been out, but no results were at hand as yet. There was a Meeting on 12th. September of the full Council, with the Crime Commissioner.

The Clerk was to speak to Gosberton Parish Council, to see who looks after their Playing Field grass cutting. Coun Bingham's costs for clearing the grass on the Playing Field were to be put towards looking after the area.
