The Parish Council met on Monday 9th. July 2018, under the Chairmanship of Coun. M. Clift.

The Clerk had been in touch with the Insurers and had been told that there would be no problem with insurance for the Family Fun Day, providing that if there was a bouncy castle, the owners had their own insurance. He had also spoken to Dawson's about cutting the grass. Mr Dawson had told the Clerk that owing to illness he had not been able to do the cutting recently. The Clerk was to speak to him again asking if the grass verges on Casswell's Drive could be cut lower.

The footpath from the Main Road to Towndrove had been cut.

Broadgate Builders wanted the Council to take over the Salem burial site. The Council thought that this was a good idea subject to some changes. They needed Broadgate to clear the site and make the Baptism pit safe. The boundary needed reinstating in the proper place and fencing. Broadgate were to be informed of these rules before anything could be decided.

PCSO Abbotts had informed the Council that recently there had been a case of criminal damage on Quadring Bank and a burglary in Watergate.

A plan from Mrs Roberts was thought to be very close to a blind bend and the next door neighbour. Also this would mean removing lots of established trees and wildlife.

Cheques for Dawsons grass cutting and the Lincs Association Affiliation Fee were signed.

A complaint had been received about the state of the old garage site on the Main Road. Complaints had also been received about speeding vehicles through the village. The Clerk was to contact the Road Safety Partnership about upgrading the speed awareness signs in the village. Coun Young expressed an interest in training for use with speed guns. The Poppy Wreath was to be discussed at the next Meeting. Potholes in Quadring Bank were to be reported.
